


Spring Gully Primary School — Landscape Strategy Plan



Design Statement

The objective of a Landscape Strategy is to create a 'roadmap' that articulates a vision that can be achieved, element by element, over time.


We received volumes of wonderful feedback from the students, parents and staff involved with Spring Gully Primary School. There was widespread support for outdoor spaces that allow children to move and play, feel challenged, explore and discover, and increase their connection with nature and the local environment.

In response to the stakeholder feedback received, we collaborated with a working group from the school to distil a series of core design themes and functional requirements that would guide the design. These are:

- Welcome experience / civic presence: enhance the first impression, improve the ergonomics of arrival and departure
- Place-making: provide more places to dwell, additional seating and more shade
- Navigation / wayfinding: clarify how the site is navigated, provide cues
- Engagement with environment: focus on the particulars of local geography and climate
- Civic responsibility: encourage children take ownership of aspects of the landscape
- Sustainability: use durable materials, promote biodiversity, harvest rainwater, select water-sensitive plants

The Landscape Strategy Plan in its final form provides the school with diverse and exciting opportunities to optimise and engage with its outdoor spaces. Our hope is that these spaces provide the backdrop for wonderful memories in the children's minds and unexpected ways for a sense of community to be created amongst the students, parents and staff.
